

## **NOTES:**

Continuation Standards: Students must have a 2.00 grade point average (GPA) in all courses used to fulfill major requirements. Students who fall below the 2.0 GPA in major coursework will be placed on program probation. If a student's major GPA falls below a 2.00 for two consecutive semesters, the student will be eligible for dismissal from the major.

To be certified for graduation, a student is required to...

- Complete no less than 120 credits, 1. including 48 credits in the BIOL major;
- Have at least a 2.0 cumulative GPA, a 2.0 BIOL GPA, and a 2.0 GPA in the minor or 2<sup>nd</sup> major;
- Complete 30 of the final 36 cr. at SLU; 3.
- Submit the on-line application for graduation at the beginning of the last semester of study.
